



ALMOST 82 % OF HORSES SOLD ALL FIGURES ON THE INCREASE

For the third consecutive year, the Osarus yearling sale was held at La Teste in the South West of France.

Before the sales, on Wednesday evening, a cocktail party was organized in partnership with the casino of Arcachon. Thus, all guests had the possibility to discuss in a relaxed and musical atmosphere.

On Thursday, after a country buffet offered by Jean Biraben and the breeders of the South West, the sale began at 2 pm to end at 7.30 pm.

A record percentage of yearlings sold

Out of 111 yearlings consigned, 91 found purchasers (5 in private sales) representing 82% of horses sold for an average price of 9 052 € and a turnover of €818 500 (€584 500 in 2009).

All figures therefore show a sharp increase compared to last year.

The top price of $\notin 28\,000$ was paid by Bertrand Dutruel on behalf of Patrick Dreux for lot 80, a filly by Ski Chief consigned by Haras des Faunes. Coming from the same stud, lot 10, an Indian Rocket filly, was knocked down for $\notin 27\,000$ to Jean-Claude Rouget.



An active market

To begin the afternoon, Guy Petit bought a Panis colt consigned by Haras de Bourgeauville for $\notin 17000$. This Normandy based stud, which was present at the sale for the first time, was satisfied to sell the 2 yearlings presented.

The sale attracted new buyers such as Sylvain Vidal (very present on the european market), Patrick Dreux, Alexandre Fracas, Joël Boisnard and Patrick Perraudin.

Regular buyers remained faithful to Osarus including foreigners, parisians, South West buyers, trainers from the West, South East and Centre East.
